**MEETING WITH TOWNSHIP PLANNER POLISTINA**  
***COAH Projects***

Township Planner Polistina reported the Michaels project which recently received site plan approval through the Planning Board and Municipal Utilities Authority was successful in obtaining financing from the state. This project will provide the Township with 76 units of affordable housing. They had a second phase planned, which included 60 units for senior affordable housing. Mr. Polistina explained financing is a little more difficult to obtain, so they have asked the Township to consider studying an area in need for rehabilitation and advised of the July 2, 2015 deadline.

Township Planner Polistina advised that the Supreme Court has ordered affordable housing to fall under the jurisdiction of the court system. This change comes with deadlines. The first one is July 8, 2015 for us to file a declaratory judgement. If successful, a new affordable housing plan will be due in five (5) months. Over the next few months, discussion will be held with Fair Share Housing, the court system and the court master who is appointed to oversee the process. Fair Share Housing has released a new cap of 2,200 units and we are at a gap between 1,000 and 2,200. The Township will need to provide a plan over the next seven (7) months to address the gap.

A brief discussion followed regarding existing affordable housing in the Township.

**MEETING WITH TOWNSHIP ENGINEER MOTT**  
***Chapter 213 Amendments***

Engineer Mott reported on amendments covered under Ordinance No. 14 and Ordinance No. 15 listed tonight for introduction which will bring stop signs throughout the Township into compliance.

### ***Community Center Landscaping Bids***

Engineer Mott reported three (3) informal quotes were received. The lowest quote was received from Michael Angerman Landscaping, Inc. and a resolution is listed tonight for consideration to award to them. Administrator Miller added that this contract is being paid for by Primax, developer of Advanced Auto as a site plan requirement.

Committeewoman Pfrommer questioned if the living flowers that were provided through a Boy Scout project will remain. Engineer Mott replied all living plants and flowers will be used.

### ***CDBG Application***

Administrator Miller reported an application has been submitted for the intersection of Ruckrein and Martin Avenue by Washington Avenue. Since that time, bids for demolition in West Atlantic City have been received. Administrator Miller has had conversations with John Lamey requesting to allocate the \$90,000 towards the demolition of the remaining two (2) buildings in West Atlantic City instead of the intersection applied for. He has not received an answer to his request.

A discussion followed between Engineer Mott and Administrator Miller in regards to the possibility of rebidding the West Atlantic City demolition project if CDBG money is being used and all six (6) motels are being demolished at one time.

### ***2014 Road Improvement Program Change Order***

Engineer Mott reported on a change order listed tonight for the 2014 Road Improvement Program. The change order is the result of additional drainage work on Isaacs Avenue.

### ***Veterans Memorial Park Bathroom Renovations***

Engineer Mott reported on the status of the project. A change order is listed tonight for approval in the amount of \$4,078. The change order covers the installation of interior waterline from outside snack stand, bathroom partitions, gutters and downspout and a concrete doorway ramp.

### ***State Transportation Trust Fund***

Engineer Mott reported we were successful in obtaining \$190,000 in funding to be used for Phase II.

### ***ACUA Road Closure***

Engineer Mott explained how he has received notice that the Atlantic County Utilities Authority will need to close Ocean Heights Avenue within the next ten (10) days for a duration of five (5) days. This is necessary for the installation of a sewer line that is coming from a leachate near the municipal golf course and 500' east to the pump station on Steelmanville Road. The governing body shared their concerns on the impact this closure will cause, including traffic backup and safety concerns. Detour details are being worked out with Egg Harbor Township Police Sergeant Bergan and public announcements will be made for the motoring public. Administrator Miller directed

Engineer Mott to videotape the condition of S. Mt. Airy Road prior to the detour commencing.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### ***Lease Amendment – PAL***

Administrator Miller advised that he referred this matter to Solicitor Friedman who stated he did not see any statutory prohibition against subleasing to another nonprofit organization or agency. However, he has authored a memorandum regarding the required amendment to the current lease terms and conditions as well as, insurance and potential liability concerns. Township Committee will move forward, but this will require further discussion to include how many organizations, types of organizations, etc. Also, the Township does provide all the utilities for the facility and so more users would increase the cost of utilities. There are many factors that have to be worked out and Solicitor Friedman offered to work directly with PAL President Tavarez.

#### ***Recreational Trail Program Application***

Administrator Miller referred to Resolution 192 listed tonight which authorizes the submission of an application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Green Acres Program. This is a \$20,000 matching grant for the Nature Reserve. The Township is the owner of the property and therefore needs to submit the application.

#### ***Request to Purchase - Block 5205, Lot 42***

Administrator Miller passed out a map showing the requested parcel. All the surrounding properties are owned by Ralph Clayton and he is the requestor of this lot. The Township has no need for the property, which is located in the middle of the woods and selling it would benefit the taxpayers by putting it back on the tax roll. Administrator Miller and Tax Assessor Lavner have agreed the price should be set at \$1.00 per square foot. The property is approximately 5,000 square feet. The Township Committee had no objections.

#### ***Planning Board Alternate Vacancies***

Committeewoman Pfrommer recommended Dennis Kleiner. All members agreed. This appointment would transfer him from zoning board to planning board.

#### ***Anchorage Poynte Lagoon***

Administrator Miller reported the Township has become the owner of the sandy bottom of Anchorage Poynte. The owners on both sides of the lagoon would like to take ownership so that they can maintain it. They did request that we void them of taxes. Administrator Miller said Tax Assessor Lavner is unable to make the property value zero. Administrator would like to explore the possibility of the state taking ownership, since they own all the other lagoons he knows of. Township Committee had no objections.

#### ***Salary Ordinances***

Administrator Miller reported the salary ordinances scheduled for tonight are for the July 1<sup>st</sup> salary

increases pursuant to the PBA and GWU agreements signed several years ago. The increase is 2%, but since the increase is not effective until July 1<sup>st</sup>, it is actually 1% this year.

### ***2014 Audit***

Administrator Miller referred to Resolution 187 listed tonight. There are no recommendation in this year's audit.

### ***Budget – 2015***

Mayor McCullough asked if the governing body had any changes to the budget documents they received prior to this evening adoption. No one had any concerns.

Mayor McCullough recognized Kathy McIntyre for her 25 years of dedicated service and presented her with a crystal oblique. The Mayor thanked Kathy for her unprecedented service to our residents, especially during snow storms.

<p>Administrator Miller gave a brief overview of the budget amendments that do not require re-advertisement and the budget can be adopted as amended. The legal O &amp; E was increased by \$35,000 and in the Police Department \$41,000 was adjusted between O &amp; E to Salary and Wages to retain a third Police Captain. Group Insurance and Gasoline O &amp; E were both reduced. Two grants totaling \$9,000 are being inserted into the budget. The reserve for uncollected taxes went up by approximately \$13,000. Administrator Miller referred to the FEMA monies that were originally in the budget being removed because we could not adopt the budget until the money was in hand. Therefore, this budget will not reflect the possibility of the additional \$300,000. To offset that loss, the Open Space fund has been adjusted. The amendments create a \$503,341 increase which is a 1.2 cent increase in the tax rate over last year.</p>

<b>Open Space</b>	Administrator Miller reviewed the budget process concerning Open Space Trust Fund Monies as follows: In 2015 the Township is proposing to have \$250K included for property acquisition to continue preserving open space. The Township has \$370K for capital improvement projects. Of that \$370K, a total of \$50K is targeted for the Nature Reserve, \$40K for Historical Society, \$30K for Canale Park, \$50K for Maintenance Equipment and \$200K for Various improvements. We will be collecting in excess of \$800K. We ended the year with a balance of \$1,599,847.16. At the end of the year, if we do all the proposed projects, we will have over \$750K in the open space fund.

**2014 Audit**

Auditor Moore thanked the committee for allowing them to attend and asked his assistant Carol Kiniry to give a brief overview of the audit. Ms. Kiniry advised that the audit went smoothly and thanked all staff members for their prompt and professional assistance. All records were found to be in order and therefore, the audit does not include any findings or recommendations this year. A recommendation was made in last year’s audit regarding the ambulance squad and the new director took care of it last year.

Auditor Moore commented that the Township’s budget is a comprehensive and forward looking budget, which reflects highly on personnel.

#### *Township Committee:*

Committeeman Finnerty attended the opening day for baseball and commented that all the fields were in great condition and all the improvements are looking good.

Committeeman Cafero praised the administrator and department heads for a perfect audit and thanked them for the outstanding achievement.

Committeeman Hodson reported on the Tree Recovery Campaign and the distribution of 1500 seedlings. Approximately 100 residents received seedlings on Saturday at the Nature Reserve. The remaining seedlings will be given to the scouts and schools to put them to good use. WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Township of Egg Harbor has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2015 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the governing body of the Township of Egg Harbor that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:

- a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
- b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
- c. Cash deficit of preceding year
- d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
- e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
- f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.

2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.

4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:

- a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
- b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
- c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.

6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWED CONSENT AND PERMISSION TO SOUTH JERSEY GAS COMPANY TO USE THE PUBLIC STREETS TO FURNISH GAS FOR LIGHT, HEAT, AND POWER IN THE TOWNSHIP OF EGG HARBOR, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

**WHEREAS**, South Jersey Gas Company, a corporation of the State of New Jersey, provides natural gas service to customers located within the municipal boundaries of the Township of Egg Harbor pursuant to a municipal consent heretofore granted to South Jersey Gas Company by Ordinance adopted on November 3, 1947; and

**WHEREAS**, the consent to the use of streets, alleys, squares and public places within the Township of Egg Harbor (the "Municipal Consent") is limited by N.J.S.A. 48:3-15 to a term of fifty (50) years which expired in November of 1997; and

**WHEREAS**, notwithstanding the expiration of the term of the Municipal Consent, the South Jersey Gas Company has continued to provide service to customers within the Township of Egg Harbor in compliance with its statutory obligation under Title 48 of the New Jersey Statutes applicable to utility companies generally and gas utility companies specifically; and

**WHEREAS**, letter petition dated February 3, 2014, South Jersey Gas Company now seeks, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:3-15, to renew the Municipal Consent for an additional term; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:3-15 a municipality is authorized to grant such consent for the right to use the street(s) petitioned for, by ordinance and not otherwise, for a period not exceeding fifty (50) years; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 48:3-13 requires that public notice shall be given by publication once a week for at least two weeks in one or more newspapers published and circulated in the municipality and by posting notice in five (5) of the most public places in the municipality for at least fourteen (14) days before the meeting of the governing body at which the application shall be considered; and

**WHEREAS**, having given due and proper consideration to the petition submitted on behalf of South Jersey Gas Company, having published and posted the notices required by law and having provided the opportunity for public comment;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1.** That consent and permission is hereby renewed and granted to South Jersey Gas Company (the "Company") to lay and construct its pipes and mains and related appurtenances and facilities within the streets, alleys, squares and public places within the Township of Egg Harbor in the manner prescribed by N.J.S.A. 48:9-21, and subject to reasonable regulations imposed by ordinance or resolution with respect to the opening of streets and public places, including street opening moratoriums.

**SECTION 2.** This consent is granted to the Company for the entire geographical area of the Township of Egg Harbor extending to the boundaries thereof, and shall remain in effect for a period ending November 3, 2047 being fifty (50) years from the expiration of the consent in 1997, subject to the right of the Company to seek such changes herein as it may deem necessary and reasonable from time to time prior to the expiration of said period.

**SECTION 3.** Throughout the full term of this ordinance, the Company, for itself, its successors and assigns, agrees to maintain its property within the Township of Egg Harbor in good order and shall furnish safe, adequate and proper service within the Township at just and reasonable rates as approved from time to time by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. At and after expiration of the term of this ordinance, the Company shall safeguard the public interest in continuous and uninterrupted services within the Township until such time as the Municipal Consent shall be renewed.

**SECTION 4.** As a condition of this Municipal Consent, whenever a curb line shall be established on streets where one does not now exist, or where an established curb line shall be relocated in order to change the width or realign an existing street in conjunction with road construction being performed by or at the direction of the Township, the Company shall change the location of its belowground facilities covered by this ordinance, so that the same shall be back of, and adjacent to, the new curb line so long as the Township has acted in accordance with applicable law and with reasonable care in establishing the new curb line and providing notice thereof. This requirement includes that the Township owns the existing or acquired right-of-way where the Company is being requested to locate or relocate facilities, and that the new curb line is properly established by ordinance, filed map and/or official map.

The Company shall bear the costs of such relocation so long as the relocation is for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, improvement or repair to streets, sidewalks, sewers, water mains, storm drains, and other Township utilities and infrastructure, and not solely for aesthetic

purposes or in, on, along, over or under any sewerage facility project as governed by N.J.S.A. 40A:26A-8.

**SECTION 5** Following final passage of this ordinance, the Township Clerk shall provide the Company with written notice thereof by certified mail.

**SECTION 6.** As provided by N.J.S.A. 48:2-14 and all other applicable law, this ordinance shall not become effective until acceptance thereof by the Company and approval thereof by the State of New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.

**SECTION 7.** This ordinance shall cancel and supersede all prior consent ordinances between the Township and the Company regarding the subject matter hereof.

**SECTION 8:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 9:** Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 10:** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

Ordinance No. 11

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 158 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED "NOISE"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee for the Township of Egg Harbor, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey that:

SECTION 1: Chapter 158 of the Township Code is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

## §158-1 Declaration of Findings and Policy

WHEREAS, excessive sound is a serious hazard to the public health, welfare, safety, and the quality of life; and

WHEREAS, a substantial body of science and technology exists by which excessive sound may be substantially abated; and

WHEREAS, the people have a right to, and should be ensured of, an environment free from excessive sound;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, it is the policy of Township of Egg Harbor to prevent excessive sound that may jeopardize the health, welfare, or safety of the citizens or degrade the quality of life.

This Chapter of the Township Code shall apply to the control of sound originating from sources within the Township of Egg Harbor.

## §158-2 Definitions

The following words and terms, when used in this Chapter, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise. Terms not defined in this Chapter have the same meaning as those defined in N.J.A.C. 7:29.

"**Construction**" means any site preparation, assembly, erection, repair, alteration or similar action of buildings or structures.

"**dB(C)**" means the sound level as measured using the "C" weighting network with a sound level meter meeting the standards set forth in ANSI S1.4-1983 or its successors. The unit of reporting is dB(C). The "C" weighting network is more sensitive to low frequencies than is the "A" weighting network.

"**Demolition**" means any dismantling, destruction or removal of buildings, structures, or roadways. "Department" means the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

"**Emergency work**" means any work or action necessary at the site of an emergency to restore or deliver essential services including, but not limited to, repairing water, gas, electricity, telephone, sewer facilities, or public transportation facilities, removing fallen trees on public

rights-of-way, dredging navigational waterways, or abating life-threatening conditions or a state of emergency declared by a governing agency.

**"Impulsive sound"** means either a single pressure peak or a single burst (multiple pressure peaks) that has a duration of less than one (1) second.

**"Minor Violation"** means a violation that is not the result of the purposeful, reckless or criminally negligent conduct of the alleged violator; and/or the activity or condition constituting the violation has not been the subject of an enforcement action by any authorized local, county or state enforcement agency against the violator within the immediately preceding twelve (12) months for the same or substantially similar violation.

**"Motor vehicle"** means any vehicle that is propelled other than by human or animal power on land.

**"Muffler"** means a properly functioning sound dissipative device or system for abating the sound on engines or equipment where such device is part of the normal configuration of the equipment.

**"Multi-dwelling unit building"** means any building comprising two or more dwelling units, including, but not limited to, apartments, condominiums, co-ops, multiple family houses, townhouses, and attached residences.

**"Multi-use property"** means any distinct parcel of land that is used for more than one category of activity. Examples include, but are not limited to:

1. A commercial, residential, industrial or public service property having boilers, incinerators, elevators, automatic garage doors, air conditioners, laundry rooms, utility provisions, or health and recreational facilities, or other similar devices or areas, either in the interior or on the exterior of the building, which may be a source of elevated sound levels at another category on the same distinct parcel of land; or
2. A building, which is both commercial (usually on the ground floor) and residential property, located above, below or otherwise adjacent to.

**"Noise Control Officer"** (NCO) means an employee of a local, county or regional health agency which is certified pursuant to the County Environmental Health Act (N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-21 et seq.) to perform noise enforcement activities or an employee of a municipality with a Department-approved model noise control ordinance. All NCOs must receive noise enforcement training as specified by the Department in N.J.A.C. 7:29 and is currently certified in noise enforcement. The employee must be acting within his or her designated jurisdiction and must be authorized to issue a summons.

**"Noise Control Investigator"** (NCI) means an employee of a municipality, county or regional health commission that has a Department-approved model noise control ordinance and the employee has not received noise enforcement training as specified by the Department in N.J.A.C. 7:29. However, they are knowledgeable about their model noise ordinance and enforcement procedures. A Noise Control Investigator may only enforce sections of the ordinance that do not require the use of a sound level meter. The employee must be acting within his or her designated jurisdiction and must be authorized to issue a summons.

**"Plainly audible"** means any sound that can be detected by a NCO or an NCI using his or her unaided hearing faculties of normal acuity. As an example, if the sound source under investigation is a portable or vehicular sound amplification or reproduction device, the detection of the rhythmic bass component of the music is sufficient to verify plainly audible sound. The NCO or NCI need not determine the title, specific words, or the artist performing the song.

**"Private right-of-way"** means any street, avenue, boulevard, road, highway, sidewalk, alley or easement that is owned, leased, or controlled by a non-governmental entity.

**"Public right-of-way"** means any street, avenue, boulevard, road, highway, sidewalk, alley or easement that is owned, leased, or controlled by a governmental entity.

**"Public space"** means any real property or structures thereon that are owned, leased, or controlled by a governmental entity.

**"Real property line"** means either (a) the vertical boundary that separates one parcel of property (i.e., lot and block) from another residential or commercial property; (b) the vertical and horizontal boundaries of a dwelling unit that is part of a multi-dwelling unit building; or (c) on a multi-use property as defined herein, the vertical or horizontal boundaries between the two portions of the property on which different categories of activity are being performed (e.g., if the multi-use property is a building which is residential upstairs and commercial downstairs, then the real property line would be the interface between the residential area and the commercial area, or if there is an outdoor sound source such as an HVAC unit on the same parcel of property, the boundary line is the exterior wall of the receiving unit). Note- this definition shall not apply to a commercial source and a commercial receptor which are both located on the same parcel of property (e.g., a strip mall).

**"Sound production device"** means any device whose primary function is the production of sound, including, but not limited to any, musical instrument, loudspeaker, radio, television, digital or analog music player, public address system or sound-amplifying equipment.

**"Sound reduction device"** means any device, such as a muffler, baffle, shroud, jacket, enclosure, isolator, or dampener provided by the manufacturer with the equipment, or that is otherwise required, that mitigates the sound emissions of the equipment.

**"Weekday"** means any day that is not a federal holiday, and beginning on Monday at 7:00 a.m. and ending on the following Friday at 6:00 p.m.

**"Weekends"** means beginning on Friday at 6:00 p.m. and ending on the following Monday at 7:00 a.m.

### **§158-3 Applicability**

A. This model noise ordinance applies to sound from the following property categories:

1. Industrial facilities;
2. Commercial facilities;
3. Public service facilities;
4. Community service facilities;
5. Residential properties;

6. Multi-use properties;
  7. Public and private right-of-ways;
  8. Public spaces; and
  9. Multi-dwelling unit buildings.
- B. This model noise ordinance applies to sound received at the following property categories:
1. Commercial facilities;
  2. Public service facilities;
  3. Community service facilities (i.e. non-profits and/or religious facilities)
  4. Residential properties;
  5. Multi-use properties;
  6. Multi-dwelling unit buildings.
- C. Sound from stationary emergency signaling devices shall be regulated in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:29-1.4, except that the testing of the electromechanical functioning of a stationary emergency signaling device shall not meet or exceed ten (10) seconds.

#### **§158-4 Exemptions**

- A. Except as provided in 158-9 and 158-10 below, the provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to the exceptions listed at N.J.A.C. 7:29-1.5.
- B. Sound production devices required or sanctioned under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), FEMA or other government agencies to the extent that they comply with the noise requirement of the enabling legislation or regulation. Devices which are exempted under N.J.A.C. 7:29-1.5 shall continue to be exempted.
- C. Construction and demolition activities are exempt from the sound level limits set forth in tables I and II and III except as provided for in Section 158-9 below.

#### **§158-5 Exemptions**

- A. Noise Control Officers shall have the authority within their designated jurisdiction to investigate suspected violations of any section of this Chapter and pursue enforcement activities.
- B. Noise Control Investigators shall have the authority within their designated jurisdiction to investigate suspected violations of any section of this Chapter that do not require the use of a sound level meter (i.e., plainly audible, times of day and/or distance determinations) and pursue enforcement activities.
- C. Noise Control Officers and Investigators may cooperate with NCOs and NCIs of an adjacent municipality in enforcing one another's municipal noise ordinances.

#### **§158-6 Measurement Protocols**

- A. Sound measurements made by a Noise Control Officer shall conform to the procedures set forth at N.J.A.C. 7:29-2, except that interior sound level measurements shall also conform

with the procedures set forth in Section 158 (B) of this Chapter and with the definition of "real property line" as contained herein.

- B. When conducting indoor sound level measurements across a real property line the measurements shall be taken at least three (3) feet from any wall, floor or ceiling and all exterior doors and windows may, at the discretion of the investigator, be closed. The neighborhood residual sound level shall be measured in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:29-2.9(b)2. When measuring total sound level, the configuration of the windows and doors shall be the same and all sound sources within the dwelling unit must be shut off (e.g., television, stereo). Measurements shall not be taken in areas which receive only casual use such as hallways, closets and bathrooms.

**§158-7 Maximum Permissible Sound Levels**

- A. No person shall cause, suffer, allow, or permit the operation of any source of sound on any source property listed in Section 158-3(A) in such a manner as to create a sound level that equals or exceeds the sound level limits set forth in Tables I, II or III when measured at or within the real property line of any of the receiving properties listed in Tables I, II or III except as specified in 158-6(B).
- B. Impulsive Sound

Between 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., impulsive sound shall not equal or exceed 80 decibels. Between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., impulsive sound which occurs less than four (4) times in any hour shall not equal or exceed eighty (80) decibels. Impulsive sound which repeats four (4) or more times in any hour shall be measured as continuous sound and shall meet the requirements as shown in Tables I and II.

**§158-8 Sound Production Devices**

No person shall cause, suffer, allow, or permit the operation of any sound production device in such a manner that the sound crosses a property line and raises the total sound levels above the neighborhood residual sound level by more than the permissible sound level limits set forth in Table IV when measured within the residence of a complainant according to the measurement protocol in VI(B) of this ordinance. These sound level measurements shall be conducted with the sound level meter set for "C" weighting, "fast" response.

**§158-9 Restricted Uses and Activities**

The following standards shall apply to the activities or sources of sound set forth below:

- A. Excluding emergency work, power tools, home maintenance tools, landscaping and/or yard maintenance equipment used by a residential property owner or tenant shall not be operated between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., unless such activities can meet the applicable limits set forth in Tables I, II or III. At all other times the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III do not apply. All motorized equipment used in these activities shall be operated with a muffler and/or sound reduction device.
- B. Excluding emergency work, power tools, landscaping and/or yard maintenance equipment used by nonresidential operators (e.g. commercial operators, public employees) shall not be operated on a residential, commercial, industrial or public (e.g. golf course, parks, athletic fields) property between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on weekdays, or between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekends or federal holidays, unless such activities can meet the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III. At all other times the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III do not apply. All motorized equipment used in these activities shall be operated with a muffler and/or sound reduction device.
- C. All construction and demolition activity, excluding emergency work, shall not be performed between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays and weekends and

federal holidays, unless such activities can meet the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III. At all other times the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III do not apply. All motorized equipment used in construction and demolition activity shall be operated with a muffler and/or sound reduction device.

- D. Motorized snow removal equipment shall be operated with a muffler and/or a sound reduction device when being used for snow removal. At all other times the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III do not apply.
- E. All interior and exterior burglar alarms of a building or motor vehicle must be activated in such a manner that the burglar alarm terminates its operation within five (5) minutes for continuous airborne sound and fifteen (15) minutes for intermittent sound after it has been activated. At all other times the limits set forth in Tables I, II or III do not apply.
- F. Self-contained, portable, non-vehicular music or sound production devices shall not be operated on a public space or public right-of-way in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet in any direction from the operator between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. Between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., sound, operated on a public space or public right-of-way, from such equipment shall not be plainly audible at a distance of 25 feet in any direction from the operator;
- G. It shall be unlawful for any property owner or tenant to allow any domesticated or caged animal to create a sound across a real property line which unreasonably disturbs or interferes with the peace, comfort, and repose of any resident, or to refuse or intentionally fail to cease the unreasonable noise when ordered to do so by a Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator. Prima facie evidence of a violation of this section shall include but not be limited to:
  - 1. Vocalizing (howling, yelping, barking, squawking etc.) for five (5) minutes without interruption, defined as an average of four or more vocalizations per minute in that period; or,
  - 2. Vocalizing for twenty (20) minutes intermittently, defined as an average of two vocalizations or more per minute in that period.

It is an affirmative defense under this subsection that the dog or other animal was intentionally provoked to bark or make any other noise.

#### **§158-10 Motor Vehicles**

Violations of each paragraph of this section shall be considered purposeful and therefore non-minor violations.

- A. No person shall remove or render inoperative, or cause to be removed or rendered inoperative or less effective than originally equipped, other than for the purposes of maintenance, repair, or replacement, of any device or element of design incorporated in any motor vehicle for the purpose of noise control. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motorcycle which has been so modified. A vehicle not meeting these

requirements shall be deemed in violation of this provision if it is operated stationary or in motion in any public space or public right-of-way.

- B. No motorcycle shall be operated stationary or in motion unless it has a muffler that complies with and is labeled in accordance with the Federal Noise Regulations under 40 CFR Part 205.
- C. Personal or commercial vehicular music amplification or reproduction equipment shall not be operated in such a manner that it is plainly audible at distance of 25 feet in any direction from the operator between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.
- D. Personal or commercial vehicular music amplification or reproduction equipment shall not be operated in such a manner that is plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet in any direction from the operator between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

#### **§158-11 Enforcement**

- A. Violation of any provision of this Chapter shall be cause for a Notice of Violation (NOV) or a Notice of Penalty Assessment (NOPA) document to be issued to the violator by the Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator.
- B. Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty for each offense of not more than the maximum penalty pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-5, which is \$2,000 as of December 2014. If the violation is of a continuing nature, each day during which it occurs shall constitute an additional, separate, and distinct offense.
- C. Upon identification of a violation of this Ordinance the Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator shall issue an enforcement document to the violator. The enforcement document shall identify the condition or activity that constitutes the violation and the specific provision of this Chapter that has been violated. It shall also indicate whether the violator has a period of time to correct the violation before a penalty is sought.
- D. If the violation is deemed by the Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator to be a minor violation (as defined in Section 158-2 of this Chapter) a NOV shall be issued to the violator.
  - 1. The document shall indicate that the purpose of the NOV is intended to serve as a notice to warn the responsible party/violator of the violation conditions in order to provide them with an opportunity to voluntarily investigate the matter and voluntarily take corrective action to address the identified violation.
  - 2. The NOV shall identify the time period (up to ninety (90) days), pursuant to the Grace Period Law, N.J.S.A. 13:1D-125 et seq. where the responsible party's/violator's voluntary action can prevent a formal enforcement action with penalties issued by the Atlantic County Health Department. It shall be noted that the NOV does not constitute a formal enforcement action, a final agency action or a final legal determination that a violation has occurred. Therefore, the NOV may not be appealed or contested.

- E. If the violation is deemed by the Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator to be a non-minor violation, the violator shall be notified that if the violation is not immediately corrected, a NOPA with a civil penalty of not more than the maximum penalty allowed pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-5, which is \$2,000 as of December 2014, will be issued. If a non- minor violation is immediately corrected, a NOV without a civil penalty shall still be issued to document the violation. If the violation occurs again (within twelve(12) months of the initial violation) a NOPA shall be issued regardless of whether the violation is immediately corrected or not.
- F. The violator may request from the Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator, an extension of the compliance deadline in the enforcement action. The Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator shall have the option to approve any reasonable request for an extension (not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) days) if the violator can demonstrate that a good faith effort has been made to achieve compliance. If an extension is not granted and the violation continues to exist after the grace period ends, a NOPA shall be issued.
- G. The recipient of a NOPA shall be entitled to a hearing in a municipal court having jurisdiction to contest such action.
- H. The Noise Control Officer or Noise Control Investigator may seek injunctive relief if the responsible party does not remediate the violation within the period of time specified in the NOPA issued.
- I. Any claim for a civil penalty may be compromised and settled based on the following factors:
  - 1. Mitigating or any other extenuating circumstances;
  - 2. The timely implementation by the violator of measures which lead to compliance;
  - 3. The conduct of the violator; and
  - 4. The compliance history of the violator.

**SECTION 2:** If any provision or portion of a provision of this Chapter is held to be unconstitutional, preempted by Federal or State law, or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of the ordinance shall not be invalidated.

**SECTION 3:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances, which are inconsistent with any provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistencies.

**SECTION 4:** No provision of this ordinance shall be construed to impair any common law or statutory cause of action, or legal remedy there from, of any person for injury or damage arising from any violation of this ordinance or from other law.

SECTION 1: Chapter 225 of the Township Code, specifically Section 225-91, is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

### §225-91 Fees and Permits

An applicant shall be required to pay the applicable fees and/or costs.

- A. Administration fees. The following application fee shall be payable to the Zoning Officer upon application:
- (1) Zoning permit/certificate of conformity: \$50
  - (2) Zoning letter of interpretation: \$75. An interested party may submit a written request for a written determination from the Zoning Officer as to the zoning of a particular parcel or lot upon the payment of the stated fee.
- B. Permit fees. The following permit fees shall be payable to the Zoning Officer upon application (per structure/building if multiple application):
- (1) Zoning permit/commercial, new buildings, and/or additions and tenant fit up to existing buildings: \$100.
  - (2) Zoning permit/residential, garages, new single-family dwellings and/or additions to existing single-family dwelling: \$75.
  - (3) Zoning permit/residential, all accessory structures, sheds (drop off), pools, detached garages and fences: \$50.
    - (a) Fences residential \$25/commercial \$75
  - (4) Zoning permit/sign permit: residential \$50, commercial pylon \$75.00 and/or wall \$50 per sign.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

SECTION 3: Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
