**Meeting with Township Engineer Mott**

Engineer Mott provided the governing body with an update on our road program. He said this afternoon the utility poles on Blackman Road were finally moved. The contractor plans on continuing with this project Monday, depending on the weather, they are hopeful to have both Blackman Road and Poplar Avenue complete no later than Thursday of next week. He referred to the Doughty Road project and said it is the same scenario. All concrete and drainage work is complete, but Arawak is going to wait until Monday before they open the road and they plan on having both roads paved by the end of next week. Mr. Mott further reported that once Arawak completes Doughty Road, they will start the concrete and sub grading work at the firehouse. He added that they will be subcontracting most of this job. He projects all road program work should be complete within four to six weeks.

Mayor McCullough reported on a conversation he recently had with our Construction Official, where he was told that with the new casinos, we have seen a decrease in foreclosures, which is great news. We had over 1,000 foreclosures and are now at around 800. As well as, several abandoned developments are back in action. The Mayor is hopeful that this will be the trend, not only for Egg Harbor Township, but for Atlantic County.

## **New Business**

### **New Traffic Signal Route 152 and Anchorage Drive**

Administrator Miller said the State has agreed to evaluate the need for a traffic signal at this location. Unfortunately, he was advised by the State's Department of Transportation of their Policy No. 346, which requires the municipality to pay 25% of the cost. Mr. Miller has been unsuccessful in obtaining a copy of their policy and has received conflicting information regarding whether or not the 25% is for all costs associated with the design and construction/installation for the traffic signal or just the design. Therefore, if this seasonal traffic signal could potentially cost the Township over \$100,000, he is unable to recommend following through with it.

Mayor McCullough said the Township has some other issues with the Department of Transportation that need to be addressed. He said he will contact the Commissioner and arrange a meeting.

### **Steelmanville Road/Beaver Lakes – No Fishing/No Parking**

Administrator Miller said a few months ago two residents from the Beaver Lakes Development attended a meeting requesting the installation of signs prohibiting fishing, etc. on their development's private lake, as well as, on the bridge that's located on Steelmanville Road, running over the lake. Since Steelmanville Road is a county road, Administrator Miller reached out to the county. They finally responded by requesting that the township adopt an ordinance first, wherein we request that they adopt an ordinance. Administrator Miller said he had discussed this with Chief Davis and it was decided that the signs should be "No Parking" as opposed to "No Stopping/Standing". As far as signs being posted on the private lake, residents will need to continue to put up their own signs. Hopefully, the signs posted near the bridge will reduce the issues on the lake, specifically launching of boats. The governing body had no objection to an ordinance being introduced at a future meeting.

## **Other Business**

Deputy Mayor Hodson referred to correspondence Administrator Miller had circulated from the Department of Transportation in regards to the turn lanes on the Black Horse Pike. The Deputy Mayor offered his availability to attend any meetings regarding the infrastructure of the Black Horse Pike. Further discussion followed regarding future improvements planned for the Black Horse Pike. Administrator Miller also provided an update on the installation of bus shelters along the pike. This project has been in the works for about four years and after Deputy Administrator von der Hayden recently followed up on the status and they are going to finally start installing them. Discussion followed on their location; existing NJ Transit Bus Stops along the pike.

No members from EHT TV were in attendance and therefore, the Video Broadcast/Television Statement was not read.

Mayor McCullough led the Pledge of Allegiance at 5:34 PM.

# Egg Harbor Township

Ordinance No. 42

2018

**An ordinance to amend the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor by adding a new Chapter 108 to be entitled "Filming"**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The Code of the Township of Egg Harbor is hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be Chapter 108 entitled "Filming" to read as follows:

## **FILMING**

### **§108-1. Purpose.**

- A. The Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor recognizes that the filming of motion pictures, television shows or programs within the Township of Egg Harbor has been increasing and will continue to increase in the future.
- B. Filming within the Township of Egg Harbor requires various regulations to preserve the general health, safety and welfare of Egg Harbor Township inhabitants; in addition, the imposition of various fees is required to offset administrative costs incurred in processing permit applications and conducting the requisite inspections.

### **§108-2. Definitions.**

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

**Filming**- The taking of still or motion pictures either on film, videotape, digital or similar recording medium, for commercial or educational purposes intended for viewing on television, in theaters, on video receivers, on computers/internet or for institutional uses. The provisions of this chapter shall not be deemed to include the "filming" of news stories within the Township. Filming performed by one (1) individual using a handheld camera without assistance from others shall be excluded from this chapter.

**Major Motion Picture**-Any film shoot or production requiring fifteen (15) or more crew members or more than five (5) commercial vehicles, including, but not limited to, trucks, mobile homes, catering vehicles, vans and other such similar vehicles that are used in connection with the shoot or production

**Public Lands**-Any and every public street, highway, sidewalk, square, public right-of-way, public park or playground or any other public place or building within the Township which is within the jurisdiction and control of the Township of Egg Harbor.

**§108-3. Permit required.**

- A. No person or organization shall film or permit filming on public or private land within the Township without first having obtained a permit from the office of the Municipal Clerk, which permit shall set forth the approved location of such filming and the approved duration of such filming by specific reference to day or dates. No permit shall authorize filming for more than seven (7) consecutive days in any one location and in no event shall filming at one (1) location within the Township exceed a total of twenty-eight (28) days in any one calendar year, regardless of the number of permits utilized in reaching this twenty-eight (28) day maximum. Either or both of the seven (7) consecutive day and the twenty-eight (28) day limitations may be extended only if the filming requested constitutes a major motion picture as defined by §108-12 of this chapter. Said permit must be readily available for inspection by Township officials at all times at the site of the filming.
- B. All permits shall be applied for and obtained from the office of the Municipal Clerk during normal business hours. Applications for such permits shall be in a form approved by the Municipal Clerk and be accompanied by a permit fee in the amount established by this chapter in §108-13 herein. A completed permit shall be submitted, with the application fee, at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the first date of filming.
- C. If a permit is issued and, due to inclement weather or other good cause, filming does not in fact take place on the dates specified, the Municipal Clerk may, at the request of the applicant, issue a new permit for filming on other dates subject to full compliance with all other provisions of this chapter. No additional fee shall be paid for this permit.

**§108-4. Issuance of permits.**

- A. No permits will be issued by the Municipal Clerk unless applied for prior to fifteen (15) days before the requested shooting date; provided, however, that the Township Administrator may waive the fifteen (15) day period if, in his judgment,

the applicant has obtained all related approvals and adjacent property owners or tenants do not need to be notified.

- B. No permit shall be issued for filming upon public lands unless the applicant shall provide the Township with satisfactory proof of the following:
1. Proof of insurance coverage as follows:
    - (a) For bodily injury to any one person in the amount of \$1,000,000 and any occurrence in the aggregate amount of \$3,000,000.
    - (b) For property damage for each occurrence in the aggregate amount of \$500,000.
    - (c) A certificate of insurance shall be delivered to the Municipal Clerk which shall name the Township as an additional insured on the policy.
  2. An agreement, in writing, whereby the applicant agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Township from any and all liability, expense, claim or damages resulting from the use of public lands.
  3. The posting of a security deposit, the amount of \$1,000, by cash or certified check or a performance bond of \$1,500 running in favor of the Township and protecting and insuring that the location utilized will be left after filming, in a satisfactory condition, free of debris, rubbish and equipment, and that due observance of all Township ordinances, laws and regulations will be followed. Within twenty-one (21) days of the completion of the filming, the Township will return the bond if there has been no damage to public property or public expense caused by the filming.
  4. An agreement with the Township Police Department for paid police coverage during the time indicated on the permit.
- C. The holder of the permit shall take all reasonable steps to minimize interference with the free passage of pedestrians and traffic over public lands and shall comply with all lawful directives issued by the Egg Harbor Township Police Department with respect thereto.

**§108-5. Interference with public activity; notice of filming.**

- A. The holder of a permit shall conduct filming in such a manner as to minimize the inconvenience or discomfort to adjoining property owners attributable to such filming and shall, to the extent practicable, abate noise and park vehicles associated with such filming off the public streets.
- B. The holder shall avoid any interference with previously scheduled activities upon public lands and limit, to the extent possible, any interference with normal public activity on such public lands. Where the applicant's production activity, by reason of location or otherwise, will directly involve and/or affect any businesses, merchants or residents, these parties shall be given written notice of the filming at least five (5) days prior to the requested shooting date and be informed that objections may be filed with the Municipal Clerk, said objections to form a part of applicant's application and be considered in the review of the same. Proof of service of notification to adjacent owners shall be submitted to the Municipal Clerk within two (2) days of the requested shooting date.

**§108-6. Filming in residential zones.**

Filming in residential zones shall be permitted Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., provided that all requests for night scenes shall be approved in the permit to be granted in accordance with §108-9 hereof. The setup, production and breakdown required by all filming shall be included in the hours as set forth herein.

**§108-7. Refusal to issue permit; employment of patrolmen and electrician.**

- A. The Municipal Clerk may refuse to issue a permit whenever it is determined, on the basis of objective facts and after a review of the application and a report thereon by the Police Department and by other township agencies involved with the proposed filming site, that filming at the location and/or the time set forth in the application would violate any law or ordinance or would unreasonably interfere with the use and enjoyment of adjoining properties, unreasonably impede the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or otherwise endanger the public's health, safety or welfare.
- B. The Township reserves the right to require one (1) or more on-site patrolmen in situations where the proposed production may impede the proper flow of traffic, the cost of said patrolman to be borne by the applicant as a cost of production.

Where existing electrical power lines are to be utilized by the production, an on-site licensed electrician may be similarly required if the production company does not have a licensed electrician on staff.

#### **§108-8. Appeals**

- A. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Municipal Clerk denying or revoking a permit or a person requesting relief pursuant to §108-9 may appeal to the Township Committee. A written notice of appeal setting forth the reasons for the appeal shall be filed with the Municipal Clerk.
- B. An appeal from the decision of the Municipal Clerk shall be filed within ten (10) days of the Clerk's decision. The Township Committee shall set the matter down for a hearing within thirty (30) days of the day on which the notice of appeal was filed. The decision of the Township Committee shall be in the form of a resolution at the first regularly scheduled public meeting of the Township Committee after the hearing on the appeal, unless the appellant agrees in writing to a later date for the decision. If such a resolution is not adopted within the time required, the decision of the Municipal Clerk shall be deemed sustained.

#### **§108-9. Waiver of requirements of chapter by Administrator.**

The Township Administrator may authorize filming other than during the hours herein described. In determining whether to allow an extension of hours under this section, the Administrator shall consider the following factors:

- A. Traffic congestion at the location caused by vehicles to be parked on the public street.
- B. Applicant's ability to remove film-related vehicles off the public streets.
- C. When the applicant is requesting restrictions on the use of public streets or public parking during the course of the filming.
- D. Nature of the film shoot itself; e.g., indoor or outdoors; day or night; on public or private lands.
- E. Prior experience of the film company/applicant with the Township, if any.

**§108-10. Copies of permit; inspections.**

Copies of the approved permit will be sent to the Police and Fire Departments before filming takes place and to the New Jersey Film Commission. The applicant shall permit the Fire Prevention Bureau or other Township inspectors to inspect the site and the equipment to be used. The applicant shall comply with all safety instruction issued by the Division of Fire Inspection or other Township inspectors.

**§108-11. Reimbursement of certain costs.**

In addition to any other fees or costs mentioned in this chapter, the applicant shall reimburse the Township for any lost revenue, repairs to public property or other revenues that the Township was prevented from earning because of filming.

**§108-12. Special regulations for major motion pictures.**

- A. When filming is requested with respect to a major motion picture, the approved location of such filming and approved duration of such filming by specific reference to day or dates may exceed seven (7) consecutive days and/or may exceed twenty-eight (28) days in duration if approved by the Township Administrator in his discretion following a favorable review of the factors set forth in §108-9 herein.
- B. Any days necessary to be used for setup and preparation for a major motion picture filming may, in the discretion of the Administrator, be counted as a filming day where such setup is anticipated to involve one or more of the factors set forth in §108-8 hereof.

**§108-13. Fees.**

The schedule of fees for the issuance of permits authorized by this chapter are as follows:

- A. Basic filming permit: \$150. Where an applicant requests a waiver of the provision of §108-4A requiring expedited processing of a permit application within twenty-four (24) hours of the filming date, the basic filming permit fee for processing the application on an expedited basis shall be \$500.
- B. Daily filming fee payable in addition to the basic filming permit: \$500 per day.
- C. Daily filming fee payable for major motion picture: \$1,500 per day.

- D. Filming permit for nonprofit applicants filming for educational purposes (no daily rate required): \$25.
- E. Waiver of fees for student. The fees set forth herein shall be waived when filming is done by a student in grade school, middle school, high school, college or university upon receipt by the Municipal Clerk of a written certification from a teacher or administrator at the school attended by the student stating that the filming is for educational purposes only and is not intended for commercial use.

**§108-14. Violations and penalties.**

Violation of any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a minimum fine of \$100 or a maximum of \$2,000 or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 90 days or by a period of community service not exceeding 90 days. Each and every violation shall be considered a separate violation. Any person who is convicted of violating the provisions of this chapter within one (1) year of the date of a previous violation and who was fined for the previous violation may be sentenced by the court to an additional fine as a repeat offender. The additional fine imposed as a repeat offender shall not be less than the minimum or exceed the maximum fine provided herein, and same shall be calculated separately from the fine imposed for the violation of this chapter.

**SECTION 2:** All ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3:** Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption and publication according to law.

## Ordinance No. 43

2018

### An ordinance to amend the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Chapter 190, entitled “Rotary Towing and Storage”

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-3 is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§190-3. Rotary List.**

- A. This chapter hereby establishes a list of licensed tow operators to provide basic and non-basic towing services for the Township of Egg Harbor on a rotating basis. The Police Department will maintain the rotary list and determine the time period for each rotation. The list of licensed tow operators shall be determined by and under the direct supervision of the Chief of Police or his/her designee.
- B. A licensed towing operator shall be placed on the rotary list in the order in which the operator was chosen in the lottery conducted by the Police Department.
- C. No licensed tow operator may be placed on the rotary list more than once.
- D. Towing services must be provided on a twenty-four (24) hour, seven (7) days-per-week basis. It is required that a tow vehicle be on the site of the event within twenty (20) minutes of the time of the call from the Police Department. If a licensed tow operator does not perform the requested towing service as required, the next licensed tow operator or a tow operator not contained on the rotating list may be called to perform the towing service at the sole discretion of the Police Department.
- E. During adverse weather conditions or other emergency conditions, all licensed tow operators on the rotating list shall give priority to requests for towing services made by the Police Department over requests made by third parties.
- F. Unless requested by the owner or otherwise required due to exigent circumstances, all vehicles towed pursuant to this chapter shall be stored at the Township of Egg Harbor storage facility.
- G. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter may subject the licensed tow operator to fines, suspension or removal from the rotary tow list, at the discretion of the Police Department.

- H. The Police Chief may immediately suspend a licensed tow owner prior to scheduling a formal hearing on the charges if shown sufficient evidence its operations persistently violate the provisions of this chapter or where operations of the Police Department are affected in a negative manner.

**SECTION 2:** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-4 is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§190-4. Application and licensure.**

- A. An individual or entity seeking placement on the annual rotary list shall be required to submit a completed rotary tow application between August 1st and August 31st to be considered for the following year's tow rotation. Only the first eight (8) applications will be accepted and processed.
- B. All rotary tow applicants are required to request an application package furnished by the Township Clerk, and submit said application with any and all information prescribed by the Chief of Police to the Township Clerk's office no later than August 31st.
- C. All applications shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee of \$500.
- D. Applications will not be accepted prior to August 1st of the calendar year; nor will they be accepted after August 31<sup>st</sup> of the calendar year.
- E. Each rotary tow applicant must be able to demonstrate to the Township that they are thoroughly qualified and experienced in the towing and removal of vehicles of all types and that they has adequate facilities, equipment, expertise, licensing and personnel to perform the services required by the requirements contained herein this Chapter in a manner satisfactory to the Police Department.
- F. Each company must provide a written statement regarding its capability for providing towing services for heavy trucks, buses and commercial vehicles.
- G. The Police Department will conduct a background check of the rotary tow applicant, its officers and employees prior to making a determination of placement on the towing list. Any persistent violations and/or high incidence of motor vehicle accidents in the past ten (10) years may warrant a driver ineligible. A conviction for a felony will be considered ample reason to disqualify any licensed tow operator unless waived by the Township upon application and for good cause.
- H. A license may be denied, suspended, or revoked upon any of the following grounds:
  - (1) Submitting a fraudulent or misleading application.
  - (2) A criminal conviction of the towing operator or a named principal of the towing operator.

- (3) Failure to respond reliably and promptly to calls for assistance or any other unsatisfactory performance action.
  - (4) Failure to utilize safe and adequate equipment as defined herein.
  - (5) Violations of motor vehicle laws and/or municipal ordinances.
  - (6) Failure or refusal to tow or remove a motor vehicle when requested to do so by an appropriate municipal official.
  - (7) Violations of the Zoning Ordinance or any other applicable ordinances or codes of the Township of Egg Harbor pertaining to the use or condition of the premises used by the licensee in conducting the towing business.
  - (8) Violations of the provisions of this chapter or any of its rules, regulations, and policies promulgated hereto.
- I. All rotary tow applicants must receive the approval of the Police Department before issuance of a licensed tow operator's license.
  - J. An individual or entity seeking placement on the rotary list who does not meet the application's requirements must make the required corrections or additions within a time frame determined by the Police Department. Failure to do so will result in a prohibition from participating in the intended year's rotary tow list.
  - K. The Township of Egg Harbor will award four (4) rotary towing licenses annually. A lottery will be held in the event that more than four (4) qualified applicants exist. The Township of Egg Harbor has chosen a method of random selection which ensures that every qualified rotary tow applicant has an equal chance of being selected each and every time a selection takes place. The Township of Egg Harbor shall permit representatives of the affected rotary tow companies to witness the selection process. The rotary tow lottery shall be conducted under the direction of the Chief of Police or his/her designee.
  - L. Successful applicants shall be notified by the Township Clerk's office no later than December 20th of the calendar year whether they have been chosen for the rotary tow license and where they fall in the rotation.
  - M. All licensed tow operators shall be placed onto the rotary list as of January 1 of the following year after recommendation of the Police Department and approval by the Township Committee for a term of one year.

**SECTION 3:** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-5 is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§ 190-5. Denial; suspension; revocation; hearings.**

- A. When an application for a license is denied by the Township of Egg Harbor, the applicant may request a hearing on said application by the service of a notice requesting a hearing. Said notice shall be served on the Township Clerk; and at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Township Committee, a hearing date shall be set, which shall be no less than seven (7) days nor more than thirty (30) days from the day of the regularly scheduled meeting.
- B. Proceedings for the suspension or revocation of a license shall be initiated by the service of a notice of charges proffered against the licensee. Said notice shall be served by the Township Clerk or their designee, either personally or via certified mail, return receipt requested, and shall contain a date, time and place for a hearing to be held by the Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor. Said hearing shall be scheduled no less than seven (7) days nor more than thirty (30) days after the notice of the suspension or revocation shall be served upon the licensee. The licensee shall have the right to file an answer to the notice and to appear in person, or be represented by counsel, and give testimony at the place and time fixed for the hearing.
- C. The suspension or revocation shall be effective immediately upon service of notice to the licensee.

**SECTION 4:** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6B, 6C and 6D is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§ 190-6B. Cards and statement of rates.**

- (1) The licensed tow operator, at his own expense, shall prepare three-inch-by-five-inch printed rate cards which shall be first approved by the Police Department. The cards will then be provided to the Police Department for distribution to vehicle owners in need of towing services.
- (2) The rate card shall provide information on claiming a vehicle, the name of the business, its owner, tow operator's license number, as well as the business location, telephone number and hours of operation for the public. The card shall also state its rates for towing services and include all methods of acceptable payment. At least one form of online payment (i.e. credit card, Paypal, etc.) shall be made available. The rate card must disclose that no fees (i.e. surcharges) will be charged to the vehicle owner for the use on any online method of payment.
- (3) The rates applicable to towing services performed hereunder shall be posted in a conspicuous place, visible to the public, at the licensed tow operator's place of business.

- (4) The licensed tow operator shall, at his expense, prepare a printed itemized bill for distribution to the customer, reflecting the fee to be paid in accordance with the rates stated on the printed card, unless otherwise approved by the Police Department. The bill shall also include the information set forth within this section, as well as a statement to the effect that all complaints shall be referred to the Police Department. The format of this form shall be approved by the Chief of Police or his/her designee. Any and all complaints received by the Police Department and/or the Chief or Police shall be investigated and documented. Citations will be issued for violations of this chapter. Persistent violations may result in suspension and/or revocation of license.
- (5) The licensed tow operator shall accept from any owner or his representative methods of payment in the form of cash, certified check, money order and by at least one major credit card. The licensed tow operator is not obligated to accept personal checks for payment. Each licensed tow operator shall either offer payment by telephone or online service. Receipts for such (in detail) shall be faxed or emailed to the Police Department directly as proof of payment.

**§ 190-6C. Hours of service.**

- (1) Towing services must be provided on a twenty-four (24) hour, seven (7) days-per-week basis.
- (2) All light-duty wreckers/flatbed wreckers/car carriers must be equipped with a two-way radio, or comparable means of communication such as cellular telephones, to facilitate prompt response.
- (3) It is required that a tow vehicle be on the site of the event within twenty (20) minutes of the time of the call from the Police Department. The licensed tow operator shall provide the Police Department a telephone number which will be manned at all times to quickly dispatch tow vehicles.
- (4) The licensed tow operator's normal hours of operation for the public shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and 12:00 noon to 4:00 p.m. on Sunday.

**§ 190-6D. Employees.**

- (1) Licensed tow operators shall employ a sufficient number of employees to comply with the minimum operational requirements at all times. If a licensed tow operator shall not have a driver available when it is their responsibility to tow they will immediately be suspended from the rotation list.
- (2) No person shall be employed by the licensed tow operator for towing hereunder unless he has submitted to a background check and has been approved by the Police Department.

- (3) All drivers of the licensed tow operator shall be over the age of eighteen (18) years and must have a valid, current New Jersey State driver's license with the proper endorsement(s) and shall be in good health and of good moral character.
- (4) In order to keep information current, the licensed tow operator will be required to submit a roster of drivers to the Police Department two (2) weeks prior to the start of a tow rotation for that company. No driver shall perform services hereunder unless previously listed by the licensed tow operator and approved by the Police Department.
- (5) Complaints of any kind relative to service, overcharging, theft of parts, damage to towed vehicles, discourteous treatment and the like shall be referred to the Police Department for investigation. Failure of the licensed tow operator to cooperate with the Police Department in its investigation shall constitute grounds for revocation of their license.
- (6) All employees of the licensed tow operator shall wear uniform clothing with a name patch indicating the employee's first name and name of the licensed tow operator's company.
- (7) All employees shall be clean, neat and make a good appearance.
- (8) All employees of the licensed tow operator will be required to wear photo identification badge, approved by the Police Department.
- (9) All employees shall wear a safety vest minimally rated at an ANSI Level II.
- (10) The licensed tow operator agrees that the owners or officers of the licensed tow operator shall be responsible, except as otherwise provided by law, for the negligent acts of its employees while acting hereunder.

**SECTION 5.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6E(2) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (2) Seek employment by repeatedly and persistently driving his tow vehicle in a short space in front of any disabled vehicle or by otherwise interfering with the proper and orderly progress of traffic along the public highways. The licensed tow operator shall wait until he receives official notification from the Police Department before commencing operations.

**SECTION 6.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6E(5) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (5) Solicit, demand or receive from any person any pay, commission or emolument whatsoever, except the proper fee for transporting the disabled vehicle in accordance with the schedule of service rates listed in these specifications. Approved rate cards shall be carried at all times and available for distribution by the driver of the tow company.

**SECTION 7.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6F(1) and 190-6F(2) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (1) The licensed tow operator must provide with his application a detailed listing of the equipment to be utilized while on the towing list, including a listing of equipment demonstrating their capability for towing heavy trucks, buses and commercial vehicles.
- (2) The listing shall include the following information: type of vehicles; make, model and year of vehicles; vehicle color; VIN number; vehicles license plate number; storage location of vehicles and whether the vehicle is owned or leased.

**SECTION 8.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6F(5) and 190-6F(6) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (5) All licensed tow operators approved for participation with the rotary tow list shall meet all of the licensing requirements of the Township.

**SECTION 9.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6H(10) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (10) A licensed tow operator's failure to comply with the provisions listed in this section will be cause for suspension from the rotary tow list.

**SECTION 10.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6I(2) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (2) All regulations, policies and procedures shall be made available for inspection by the public at the Township Clerk's office during normal business hours.

**SECTION 11.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-6J(2) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (2) Any disputes over the interpretation of this chapter, including the reasonableness of any charges assessed, shall be settled amicably, if possible, through discussions between the licensed tow operator and the Police Department.

**SECTION 12.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-7D and 7E is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- D. Basic towing services provided during the day between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. shall be charged a flat fee of \$135.
- E. Basic towing services provided during the evening between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 6:59 a.m., weekends, or during New Jersey State holidays, shall be charged a flat fee of \$150.

**SECTION 13.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-7F(3) is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

- (3) Basic and non-basic towing fees shall be charged in accordance with the following schedule:

**SECTION 14.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-9 is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§ 190-9 Charge for service.**

- A. The towing fees set forth for basic towing service and those billed for non-basic towing service are the amounts that the licensed tow operator will charge to the vehicle owner or representative. Unless otherwise provided herein, the Township shall never be responsible for payment of any towing charges, except for Township-owned vehicles and/or those towed for investigative circumstances as stated in section 190-7F.(3).
- B. In the event that the Police Department requires a vehicle involved in a crime, a crash involving serious bodily injury or a fatality to be held for investigation, the Chief of Police may, after review of all of the circumstances, waive storage fees, or a portion thereof, incurred up to the date of release.

**SECTION 15.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-10 is hereby amended by adding the following:

- C. A certificate of insurance reflecting the above coverages shall be submitted with the application to the Township Clerk's office and the Police Department. Subsequent renewals of coverage shall be submitted to the Township Clerk's office and the Police Department. Any policy cancellation notices must be provided to the Township Clerk's office and the Police Department.

**SECTION 16.** Chapter 190 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 190-14 is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

**§ 190-14 Violations and penalties.**

Any licensed tow operator who violates any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or a term of imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days or a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days, or any combination of the foregoing.

**SECTION 17.** All ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 18:** Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 19.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption and publication according to law.

## Ordinance No. 44

2018

### **An ordinance to amend the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Chapter 165, Section 165-5, Rules and Regulations**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Egg Harbor, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Chapter 165 of the Code of the Township of Egg Harbor, Section 165-5, Rules and Regulations, is hereby amended by adding to the following:

T. A limited number of passenger cars (not to exceed five (5) in total) may be issued a permit to park during hours when the park and/or recreation area is closed for public use.

(1). Application for parking permit. Application for a parking permit shall be made, in writing, to the Chief of Police or his designee upon such forms as shall be prepared by the office of the Chief of Police.

(2). Conditions for granting of permit. Parking permits shall be granted to the following person or persons under terms and conditions as hereinafter set forth: to persons who are property owners on any street abutting a park and/or recreation area, where parking is prohibited in front of their property.

(3). Cost of Permit. A permit will be issued on a calendar year basis for a fee of twenty dollars (\$20).

(4). Surrender of permit. An applicant for a parking permit shall show to the Chief of Police or his designee satisfactory evidence that such person fulfills all the conditions required for the issuance of a permit. Whenever the conditions no longer exist, any person holding such permit shall surrender the same to the Chief of Police or his designee.

(5). Permit renewal. No permit issued hereunder shall be valid for more than one (1) year, but may be renewed upon expiration, provided that the conditions for the issuance thereof still exist.

(6). Violations and penalties. Are in accordance with the provisions of Section 165-10 of this Chapter.

**SECTION 2.** All ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

1. 2. A deposit of ten percent (10%) of the minimum price for real property must be paid in cash or by certified bank check by the successful bidder at the time of the offer; said time and place set forth herein. This deposit shall be made subject to return in the event of rejection of said offer. The balance, together with the costs of sale and legal expenses must be paid at closing in cash or by certified bank check.

3. These costs of sale described in paragraph 2 above, shall include, but are not limited to, legal expenses, title search fees, insurance fees, appraisal fees, survey fees, recording fees, and any such other costs of sale; but this shall not obligate the Township to incur these expenses or provide these services. The successful bidder shall be responsible for any and all such costs. The Township reserves the right upon completion of the sale to accept or reject the highest bids made at the public sale; which acceptance or rejection shall be made no longer than the second regular meeting of the Township Committee following the sale.

4. Upon acceptance of a bid and payment of all costs and expenses related thereto, the Township of Egg Harbor shall issue a Quit Claim Deed; without covenants; to the successful and accepted bidder.

5. The parcel shall be subject to all restrictions, covenants, easements, rights of way, exceptions, liens; whether any or all are known or unknown and whether or not of record. No representations, covenants, promises, or warranties are made by the Township of Egg Harbor as to title, and responsibility for determining clear and marketable title rests solely with the bidders who shall govern themselves accordingly. The property in question shall otherwise be sold subject to all



existing Federal, State, County and Municipal laws, including, but not limited to, current zoning, health, and planning laws; rules and regulations.
